The overall objective of the course is to enable students to interpret and apply the laws and procedures relating to taxes levied in terms of the Income Tax Act, with particular reference to the following: (1) the Income Tax Act, as applicable for the 2010 year; (2) Important decisions of the courts; (3) the practices of the Commissioner for the South African Revenue Services. The course is also supportive of the Financial Accounting II syllabus and will aim to enable students to not only be competent in applying the Income Tax legislation but also to be able to identify and calculate the differed tax implications for a company or individual.
